I am a registered voter of Florida and hereby petition the Secretary of State to place the following proposed amendment to the Florida Constitution on the ballot in the general election:

Ballot Title: THE FLORIDA CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT FOR FIREARM FREEDOM

Ballot Summary: This Amendment to the Constitution of the State of Florida acknowledges and affirms the natural and unalienable right of all Floridians to "keep and bear arms" without interference from the federal government, as specified by the "shall not infringe" clause of the Second Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, which is an absolute denial of authority to the federal government to encroach upon, violate, impede, restrict, regulate, control, or otherwise diminish this fundamental right.

Article and Section Being Created: Article 1 Section 28

Full Text of the Proposed Constitutional Amendment: In accordance with Article VI clause 2 of the U.S. Constitution, only federal enactments which are "in Pursuance" of the Constitution are "the supreme Law of the Land", all others being by that very fact null and void. In accordance with the "shall not infringe" clause of the Second Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, the federal government is absolutely denied authority to encroach upon, interfere with, violate, impede, impair, restrict, regulate, control, or otherwise diminish the fundamental unalienable right of the people to "keep and bear arms"; we the People of the State of Florida, as a sovereign defender of the foundations of our Republic, do hereby:

1. Acknowledge the Administrative Procedures Act of 1946, violates Article 1, Section 1 of the U.S. Constitution, and is therefore, void under Article VI, clause 2, thereby nullifying ALL laws, statutes, rules, regulations, and orders that were not written directly by Congress.
2. Acknowledge all Acts of Congress and parts thereof that encroach upon, interfere with, violate, impair, restrict, regulate, control, or otherwise diminish the fundamental and unalienable right of the People to "keep and bear arms", either in whole or in part, violate the "shall not infringe" clause of the Second Amendment of the U.S. Constitution and are thereby null and void under Article VI clause 2 of the U.S. Constitution, such enactments include but are not limited to the Federal Mailing of Firearms Act of 1927, the National Firearms Act of 1934, the Federal Firearms Act of 1938, the Federal Gun Control Act of 1968, the Federal Firearms Owner's Protection Act of 1986, and the Brady Handgun Violence Act of 1993.
