

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PETITION FORM

Under Florida law, it is a first degree misdemeanor to knowingly sign more than once a petition for a candidate, a minor political party, or an issue. Such offense is punishable as provided in s .775.082 or s 775.083. (Section 104.185, Florida Statutes)

I am a registered voter of Florida and hereby petition the Secretary of State to place the following amendment to the Florida Constitution on the ballot in the general election.

ARTICLE II GENERAL PROVISIONS SECTION 10. Maximum property insurance rates.

BALLOT TITLE: The maximum rate for property insurance on real estate and its contents shall be limited.

BALLOT SUMMARY: The maximum rate for property insurance on real estate and its contents shall be limited to 1% of the insured value and shall apply to all insurance companies including Citizens Property Insurance. The legislature will implement any and all provisions in this section. The provisions of this amendment are severable. The legislature shall, by general law, prescribe procedures necessary to administer this subsection.

CODING: Words ~~stricken~~ are deletions; words underlined are additions.

Full text of proposed amendment:

ARTICLE II GENERAL PROVISIONS SECTION 10. Maximum property insurance rates.-- The maximum rate for property insurance on real estate and its contents shall be limited to 1% of the insured value and shall apply to all insurance companies including Citizens Property Insurance. The legislature will implement any and all provisions in this section. The provisions of this amendment are severable. The legislature shall, by general law, prescribe procedures necessary to administer this subsection.
